



A GUIDE TO CAMPING



WELCOME

This camping information has been set out to help maximise your comfort and enjoyment of the campsites during the Festival of Speed.

Please remember that entry to the Festival of Speed is by advance ticket only, with no ticket sales available at the entry gates during the event. Campers are welcome to join us at Goodwood from 12 noon on Wednesday until 12 noon on Monday, so you can make the most of your

stay and avoid traffic congestion. If you require more tickets ahead of the event, please call the Ticket Office on **01243 755055**, or book online at goodwood.com

WARNINGS

OVERHEAD POWER LINES

Be advised that an overhead power line dissects the camping area. Please note the following guidelines and precautions:

- Before setting up camp, avoid pitching your tent or caravan directly under or close to an overhead power line. Please be particularly aware when erecting TV aerials or radio masts.
- Overhead power lines are often uninsulated (bare) and can carry high voltages so always hold long objects horizontally, parallel with the ground, when walking under lines.
- The lowest-voltage overhead lines can produce 10,000 times more current than is required to kill a person. It can be fatal to touch electricity wires by human touch or with an object at low voltage. Even domestic voltage (230 volts) can be lethal.
- Don't assume wires on wooden poles are telephone wires.
- Never assume electrical equipment is dead, even if wires have fallen or broken. Power can be switched back on without warning.
- Electricity can jump gaps.
- Metal and carbon-fibre tent poles, guy lines, TV aerials and almost any long object can conduct electricity.
- Rubber boots will not protect you.
- Don't light a fire / barbecue under an overhead line, as the heat could cause the wires to sag dangerously low or to break.

- Electricity poles and pylons are usually fitted with yellow 'danger of death' notices, and lines should be too. Take note of any warning signs and stay well away from the marked area.
- If there's a line close to where you are setting up your tent, awning or caravan, keep well away. Don't assume it's a telephone wire. If you have any doubts, please contact the Campsite Manager in the Campsite Office.
- Do not fly kites in the campsites under any circumstances.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

- If you come within five metres of a damaged wire, move away as quickly as you can, and warn others to stay well clear. You don't have to touch a wire that is on the ground to be injured or killed. Electrical current can travel a long way through the ground – even further if the wire falls on a fence or metallic objects.
- Always assume the lines are live, even if they're not sparking.
- If you have a mobile with you, call the emergency services.
- If you're inside a caravan (or tent or mobile home), stay inside until the emergency services arrive.
- Never touch a tent, awning, frame, caravan, post or fence you suspect is touching an electricity line.
- Wires can re-energise at any time without warning.



ARRIVAL AND SET UP

TRAVELLING TO THE EVENT

Goodwood is situated on the South Coast in West Sussex, three miles to the north of Chichester. For more detailed directions and a map, please visit goodwood.com/fostravel and click on Festival of Speed.

ARRIVALS

Please ensure your camping labels are clearly displayed on your windscreen on approach to Goodwood, and that you leave the label in the window of your vehicle for the duration of your stay on site. On your arrival, please report to the main Campsite Office and our team will carry out a swift registration process. All members of your party will be issued with wristbands. For security purposes, please wear this wristband for the duration of your stay, as access to the campsites may be denied without it.

THERE ARE THREE CAMPSITES:

- Campsite H** (public tents and campervans)
- Campsite E** (public tents, campervans and marshals)
- Campsite F** (families)

FAMILY F CAMPSITE

Our bespoke family campsite, with shuttles to and from the event, offers a child-friendly setting away from the crowds, allowing families to relax and unwind.

CAMPSITE H

Plots will be pre-allocated and numbered on the ground. The campsite manager will direct you to your plot upon arrival.

CAMPSITE OFFICE AND MANAGER

The Campsite Office, located near the main entrance to your campsite, is open from Wednesday to Monday (24 hours a day on Thursday and Friday). Check-in is between 7am and 10pm (12 noon and 10pm on Wednesday), otherwise we will not be able to put you in a pitch until the next day. Should you have any concerns, please see the Campsite Manager. Alternatively, please call the Ticket Office (open during the event between 7am and 6pm) on **01243 755055**.

INFORMATION BOARD

An information board will be installed at the Campsite Office. This will have details of local taxi companies, fast food outlets and the emergency services.

ADDITIONAL CAMPER

Each 9 x 7m pitch is for up to four people. Any extra people in your party will need to be paid for in advance (£48 per person) by calling the Ticket Office on **01243 755055** (open between 9am – 5.30pm (Wednesday) and 7am – 7pm (Thursday – Sunday)).

Children aged 12 and under are not charged for camping. Children on site must be accompanied by an adult. We only sell camping pitches for the Festival of Speed weekend, not on a nightly basis.

ADDITIONAL CARS

Only one car is allowed per pitch. Due to recommended fire regulations, cars are not permitted to be within three metres of a sleeping unit (tent / campervan / caravan etc). Therefore we recommend that you travel in one car wherever possible. If you are travelling in more than one car you will be asked to park additional vehicles in the public car parks.

VEHICLES

Your vehicle must be parked within your allocated pitch. We would recommend that use of your vehicle is kept to an absolute minimum during your stay. Anyone witnessed to be driving inappropriately in the campsites may be charged a grass reinstatement fee based on the amount of damage to the grass. The minimum charge is £250.

EVENT TIMES

Gates to the Festival of Speed open at 7am and close at 7pm.



DURING YOUR STAY

SHUTTLE SERVICE

A courtesy shuttle service of tractors/buses will run daily from 7am to 7.30pm from Campsite E to the event site. An evening bus service will run from Thursday to Sunday between the Campsite and the The Goodwood Hotel, where you can enjoy live entertainment and refreshments. Buses run from 7.30pm, with the last bus leaving the hotel at 10.45pm.

TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT

To avoid any conflict with the pedestrian traffic around the campsites, it's recommended that you avoid using your car.

Please be advised that many of the roads surrounding the campsites will be closed during the live hours of the events. If you do leave your campsite, please be aware that your return journey may involve congestion and/or diversions. There is no vehicle movement permitted between 10pm to 7am.

LEAVING ON SUNDAY NIGHT

On Sunday, all exiting traffic will be directed to the main exit near the Campsite Office and vehicles wishing to exit after 3pm will be directed to the Sunday night exit (see campsite maps in this booklet). We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause, but this route will avoid any conflict with pedestrian traffic or congestion, and will help you have a safe departure.

BARBECUES

All guests are welcome to use barbecues (do not set up under overhead power lines – see Warnings, left). Those using disposable barbecues must collect bricks from the Campsite Office to enable your barbecue to be clear of the grass and remove the risk of the grass catching fire. A barbecue disposal bin has been installed adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please do not dispose of any hot coals in the litter bins, and ensure all coals have cooled prior to disposal.

GOODWOOD BAR AND GRILL (AT THE HOTEL)

Our relaxed brasserie-style restaurant provides a welcome break from campsite fare. It's open for full English breakfasts in the morning (pre-booking is advised), while offering dinner and live music on the Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings.

THE GOODWOOD HEALTH CLUB AND SPA (AT THE HOTEL)

If you crave a bit of 'me time' during the events, you can buy a four-day weekend pass for the Goodwood Health Club, which includes use of the pool, gym, sauna and steam room. It costs £85 and is available from the reception desk. The Spa offers a range of relaxing treatments. Please call for availability and prices on **01243 520114**.

STANDPIPES

A network of standpipes providing fresh drinking water has been provided throughout the site (see campsite maps).

WASHING-UP

Washing-up facilities with hot and cold running water have been installed adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks for your convenience (see campsite maps). Please consider your fellow campers and leave the washing-up facilities in a clean and tidy state when you have finished using them.

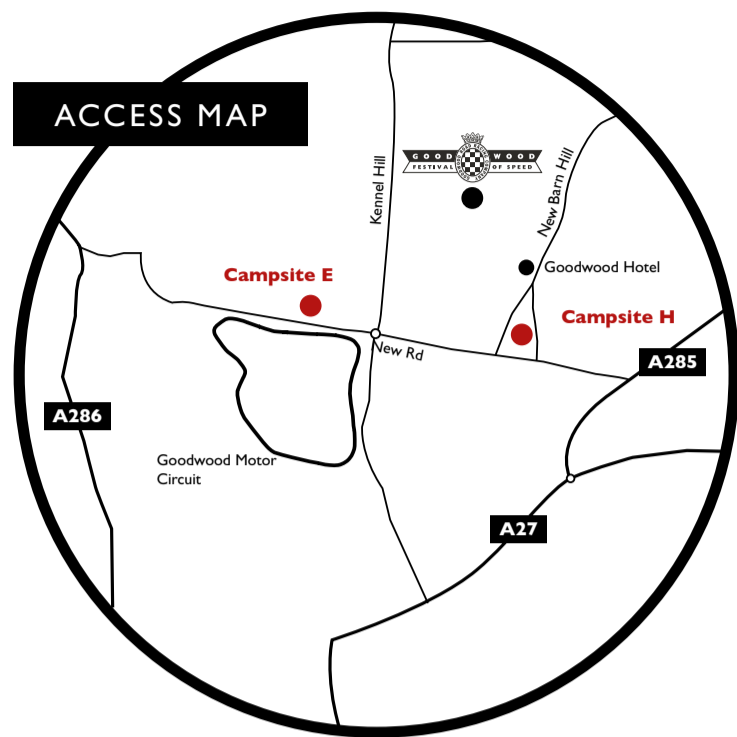
WET WASTE (CHEMICAL TOILETS)

A disposal system for chemical waste has been provided adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please note that a drive-over waste disposal system for large RVs / Winnebagos is not available.

WET WEATHER

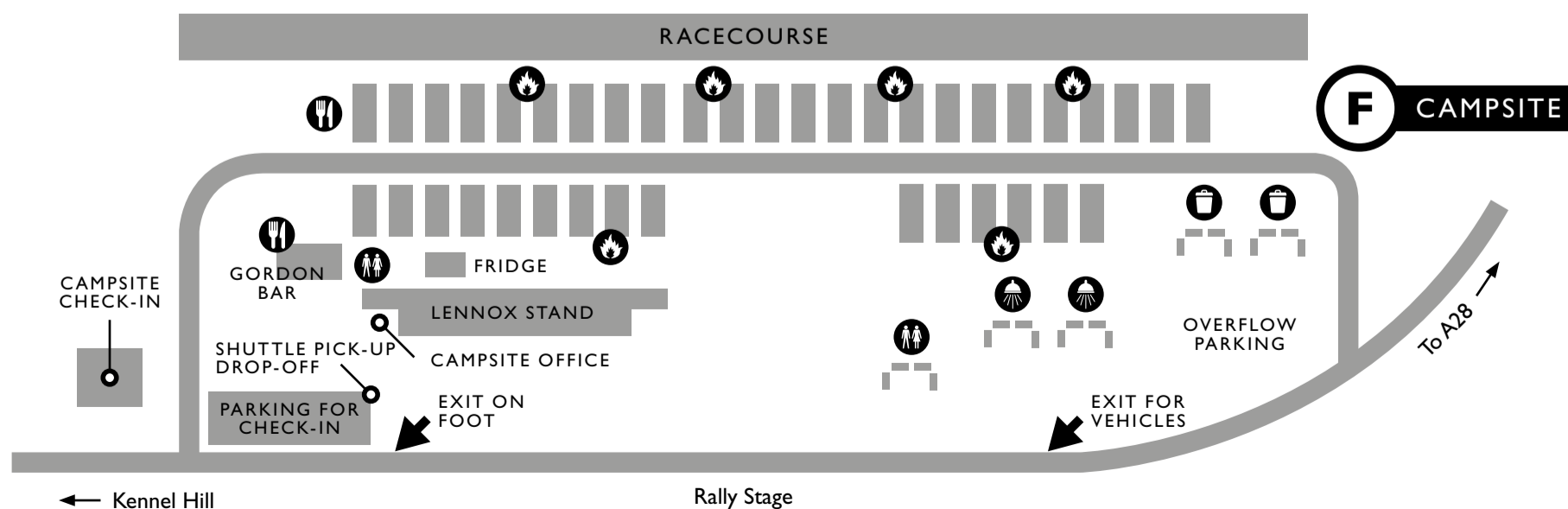
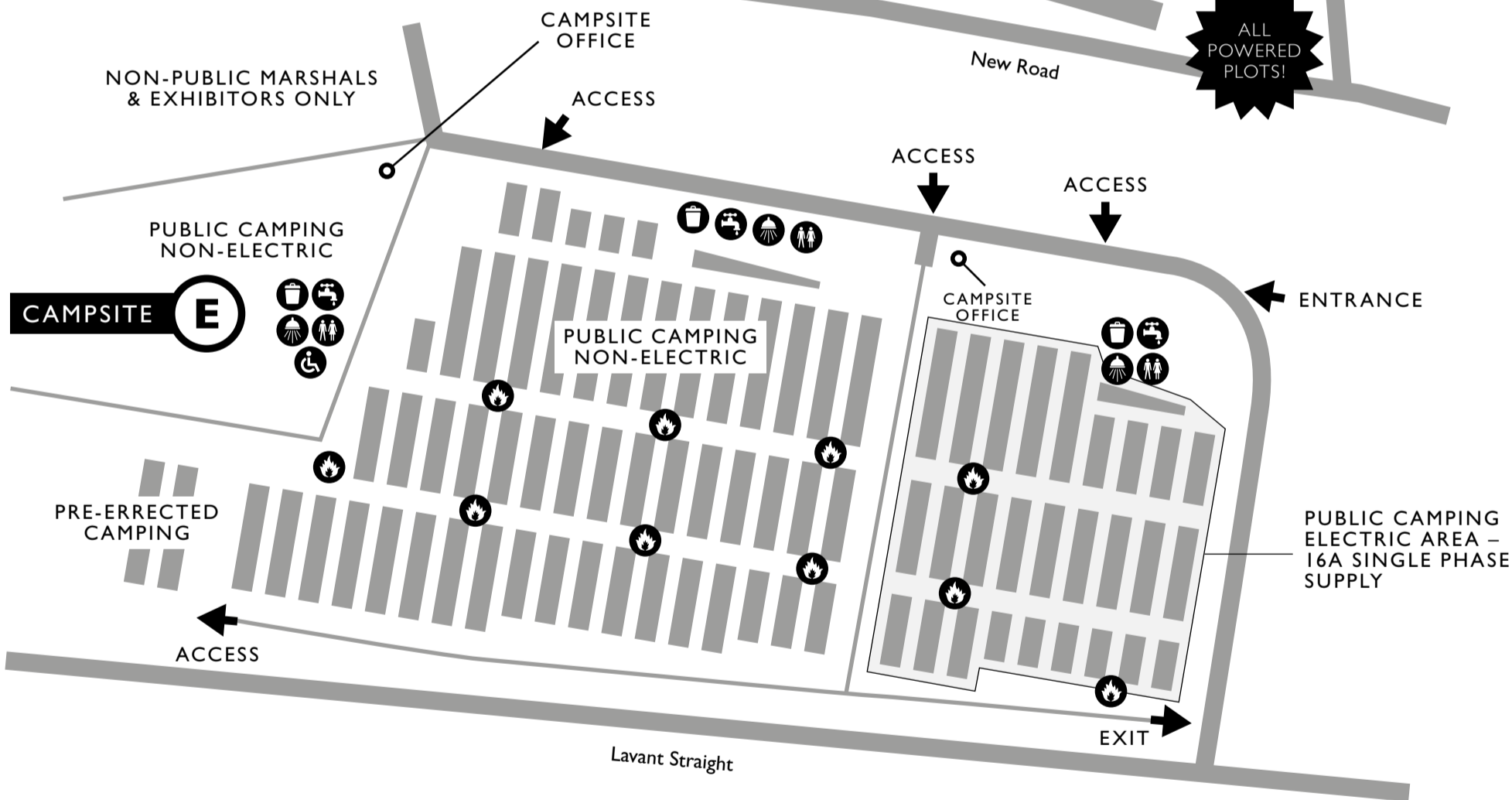
Not even Goodwood can predict the British weather, so please come prepared with the necessary supplies for camping and walking in wet and cold conditions. Should the site get damaged, or your vehicle get stuck in the mud due to heavy rain and unpleasant weather, please report to the Campsite Office and the Goodwood Control Room will supply tow support vehicles for your assistance.

USEFUL INFORMATION

CAMPFIRE

Campfires are strictly prohibited. Please do not attempt to build a campfire as it will be extinguished and you risk being asked to leave the campsite.

FIRE POINTS

Fire points have been installed along the central avenue (see maps, opposite).

IF YOU SHOULD DISCOVER A FIRE

- Raise the alarm by winding the siren on the Fire Point.
- Call **999** if appropriate.
- Inform the Duty Campsite Manager or the Campsite Security Team.
- Assist with firefighting but do not put yourself at risk.
- Await the arrival of Goodwood personnel and the emergency services. The fire extinguishers have been installed for your own safety. Do not remove them from their location unless required for firefighting. Anyone seen letting off the extinguishers will be charged £250 for a replacement.

FIREWORKS AND CHINESE LANTERNS

The use of fireworks and Chinese lanterns on the campsites is strictly prohibited.

FIRST AID

Please be aware that a 24-hour first aid service is not available in the campsites. Anyone requiring first aid must report to the Campsite Office where the Campsite Duty Manager and Security Team have 24-hour contact with the Goodwood Control Room, who can administer first aid. In an emergency, please call **999**. The South East Coast Ambulance Service and Sussex Police have been briefed on the location of the campsites.

NOISE NUISANCE

The Festival of Speed generates noise from its sporting and entertainment activities, but campers are not expected to endure noise deemed to be a nuisance between 10.30pm and 8.30am. Please be considerate to your neighbours. Persistent noise offenders will be removed from the campsites.

ORGANIC STATUS

Goodwood Estate's Home Farm has been awarded full organic status by the Soil Association and DEFRA. In order to maintain this status we wish to keep our land free from man-made chemicals such as pesticides, insecticides and bleaches that pollute the ground and ultimately end up in the food chain. Please help us by not disposing of the following matter onto the ground: chemical waste from your onboard WC (please use the chemical waste disposal system adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks), domestic cleaning substances, boiling water and cigarette and cigar butts.

PETS

Only guide dogs are permitted on site at the Festival of Speed, including all camping and car parking areas.

RUBBISH

On arrival you will be issued with large bin liners for rubbish. At the end of your stay, please place the bin liners and any waste in the skips adjacent to the shower and toilet blocks. Please leave your pitch in the state in which you found it. Anyone choosing to ignore this condition will not be invited to camp at Goodwood in the future.

SECURITY

A dedicated 24-hour security team is in attendance from 12 noon on Wednesday until 12 noon on Monday. The team is in place for your own comfort and support. Please grant them every respect during your stay. The Goodwood Road Racing Company Ltd has also installed a CCTV network to monitor the site. The network is monitored by our Security Team at all times. If you experience a breach in security or any act of anti-social behaviour please report it immediately to one of the security patrols, or directly at the Campsite Office.
